Long Arm Quilting

May's program was presented by members/longarmers Bob Moore, Kelcey Grice and Mandy Christianson. -When taking your guilt to a longarmer, please remember to include: your name/number, information about the recipient, your pressed top and backing (seams open). -Consult with your longarmer if you have ideas about the colors/stitching styles -Your backing (and batting) need to be at least 2-3" bigger on all sides to allow for loading on the machine. -Your longarmer may offer batting options for purchase and have additional services such as trimming, tacking and binding available - just askl -Be considerate of allergies and lint-roll your tops before dropping them off. -If you quilt is going into a judged show, it's important for the longarmer to know -A stay stitch 1/4" from the edge of your guilt (straight stitch) is suggested if you top does not have borders. -Each longarmer may have personal

-Each longarmer may have personal preferences or policies about use of non-traditional fabrics, such as sheets, flannel, minky and fleece - it's always best to ask before you submit

- President called meeting to order at 2:00PM
- Programs Chairperson introduced 3 of our members who are longarmers. They gave us details
 of how they gather information from their clients to help plan the quilting of their quilts;sources of
 batting at better prices and sources on internet for various types of fabrics, etc.
- Randy's Sewing will be having a long-arm quilters program once a month very soon. Details on website, which will include basics and details for customizing their quilts. Introduction to long-arm techniques will be provided.
- Baby Quilts delivered 18 quilts;10 boys and 8 girls need more boys! Colleen had gone with delivery of quilts to NICU;shared the tremendous appreciation of mothers.
- Next Sew Day is June 8th at Main Library downtown, other dates to follow.

- 8 Door prizes awarded.
- Attendance includes 56 members and 5 guests.
- Next Sew Day is 6/8/24 @ Main Library 2:00-4:00. How to put sleeve on quilt.
- Barbara Munoz won 28 black & white FQ's
- Winner of block of month, Pam Hathaway, was presented lovely Birds quilt blocks.
- Treasurer reported: Current bank balance \$8,673.18

CD	\$15,162.81
Total funds	\$23,835.99

- Also, advised have moved one matured CD to open \$6,000 account for Quilt show expenses. Other CD's moved to much higher interest rates. \$1,000 already paid as deposit for hanging pipe and drapes for quilt show. To date have received \$5,293.20 income and spent \$4,402.16. She also has raffle tickets and corrected picture of the raffle quilt for which she has tickets to be sold.
- Voted on choice of 3 themes for the 2025 Quilt Show. Those included 1. Festival of Quilts; 2. Threads of Friendship and 3. Hometown Heritage. Winner announced is Festival of Quilts.



Raffle Ticket are on sale now! See Amy Allison to pick up tickets to sell. Tickets are \$2 each - the drawing will be held December 15th.



Quilter's name on label should be covered with painter's tape or filled in after the challenge prizes are awarded.

Clarification provided at the May meeting: a panel can be used.

The required fabric is Kaufman 21618-319 "ColorWheel" by Wishwell in honeysuckle.

PETITE BUTTERLIES

FROM FABRIC A (background)

Cut 1 x 3 in rectangle.	
Cut 1 x 1.5 in rectangle	
Cut 2 3.5 in square	
Cut 2 2.0 x 7.5 rectangle.	

FROM FABRIC B FROM FABRIC D FROM FABRIC L

Cut 6 1.5 in square Cut 2 2 in square Cut 2 1.5 x 3.5 in rectangle Cut 2. 3.0 x 12.5 rectangle


Cut 2 3.5 in square Cut 4.5 in square Cut 4 x 1 in rectangle



Step 1: Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each of the Fabric A squares.

UPPER WINGS


Step 2: Place a 3.5" Fabric A square in the upper left corner of a 4.5" Fabric D square. Sew on the marked line, right sides together, as shone in the Illustration. Trim the excess and press open. Place a 1.5 in Fabric A square in the lower right corner of the unit as illustrated. Sew, trim and press open. Repeat step 2, but this time place a 3.5" Fabric A square in the upper right corner of a 4.5" Fabric D square. Sew on the marked line, right sides together, as shone in the Illustration. Trim the excess and press open. Place a 1.5 in Fabric A square in the lower left corner of the unit as illustrated. Sew, trim and

press open.

Step 3: Place 1.5 " Fabric A square in the upper right corner and lower right corner of a 3.5" Fabric B square. Note the orientation as shone in the illustration. Sew, trim and press open. Sew, trim and press a 2" Fabric A square in the lower left corner of the unit. Sew a 1.5" x 3.5 " Fabric A rectangle to the right edge of the unit. Repeat step 3, but this time place the 1.5" Fabric A squares in the upper left and lower left of Fabric B and the 2" square in the upper right. Sew a 1.5 x 3.5" Fabric A rectangle to the left edge of



ASSEMBLE THE BLOCK

Step 4: Sew a 1 x3" Fabric A rectangle to the top of Fabric L rectangle. Press. Sew a 1x1.5" Fabric A rectangle to the bottom of the unit. Press.

Step 5: Sew the left upper and left lower wing sections together. Sew the right upper and right lower wing sections together. Press. Sew the step 4 unit between the left and right wings. Press. Sew the 2.0 x 7.5 Fabric A to each side of the unit. Press. Sew the 3.0 x 12.5 Fabric A to the top and bottom of the unit. Press.
